14:10 - 14:30	<p>Introductory address</p> <p>Keynote speaker: Jiří Švarc Head of Unit D.1 - Social Policies, Child Guarantee, SPC (DG EMPL)</p>  <p>Jiří Švarc, as Head of Unit of D.1 Unit, Social Policies, Child Guarantee, SPC at DG Employment, Social Affairs, and Inclusion, is generally supervising the development of policy guidance on social policies by fostering actions at EU level aiming at fighting poverty, social exclusion and inequality, promoting inclusive labour market participation, as well as upward social convergence. The mission of unit D1 is to strengthen the social dimension of Europe, enhance the European social model and support the implementation of the European Pillar of Social Rights (in particular principles 11, 14, 20).</p>

ZSI is a private institute for applied social sciences, implementing projects on the social embedding of all types of innovations.</p> <p>Josef is professor of sociology with work experience in research institutions, funding agencies, social partners' organisations, Austrian and European RTDI policies, lecturing in various universities in Austria and abroad. He also served as President of the Austrian Sociological Association, Chairman of the European School of Social Innovation (www.essi-net.eu), Head of an M.A. study programme on social innovation, and membership in the Jury awarding the international Prize 'SozialMarie' for Social Innovation (www.sozialmarie.org), which is open to applicants from Austria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Hungary, Slovakia, and Slovenia.</p> <p>Session in a nutshell:</p> <p>This session will present new practices of social innovation actions to modify living and working conditions in parts or the whole of a society.</p> <p>The key issues pertaining to the topic of the session are – briefly outlined – as follows: 1) Social innovations are more often complementing, sometimes also driving social policies; 2) The function and impact of social innovations depend on characteristics of existing social systems in the respective national and regional cultures; 3) In most cases social innovations are instigated by dynamics of social change, and thus become involved in processes of social change.</p> <p>Such novelties may become adopted, successfully implemented and utilized by individuals, groups or organisations concerned.</p>

Session in a nutshell:

The session will present the key findings and discussion points stemming from the Final Assessment Study of the results of the social innovation calls financed by the EaSI Programme between 2014 and 2020. The moderator will first present the context and methodology of the study, then proceed with the most relevant findings, and conclude with an open-floor discussion.

The presentation of the findings will revolve around the relevance, effectiveness, and efficiency of the social experimentation and social innovation projects developed in the framework of all seven EaSI calls. The open-floor discussion will be centred around four topics: 1) conceptual understanding of social innovation; 2) positive and negative factors in upscaling and transfer; 3) fostering cross-project synergies; 4) methodologies of measuring effectiveness and efficiency of the developed social innovations.

Social innovation and experimentation under ESF+: Connecting the dots



Speaker: Risto Raivio | Senior Expert, Unit G.1 - European Social Fund+ (DG EMPL)

Risto Raivio is a senior expert in European Commission's Directorate General for Employment, Social Affairs and Inclusion. In the ESF+ coordination unit he is in charge of social innovation, including the initiative "ESF Social Innovation+" which supports scaling-up of social innovations in transnational context. During the past 26 years Mr Raivio has worked in the EU institutions on issues such as social entrepreneurship, education, training and skills, civil society and cooperation with local and regional authorities. He holds a PhD in social sciences from the University of Tampere in Finland.



Moderator: Sara Brandão | Head of Unit @ INOVA+

Sara Brandão is the Head of the Unit for International Services and Assistance at INOVA+. She worked for more than 15 years as a consultant and project manager, being involved in national and international cooperation initiatives. Sara is responsible for screening and selecting funding opportunities for the business area and clients, overseeing the preparation of proposals, and managing projects and services.

Over the years, she coordinated and participated in several EU and International funded projects, services and studies linked to several fields, including among others education and training, culture and creative industries, business in general, and entrepreneurship in the areas of innovation and business development. Sara is also experienced in organising events and using participatory methodologies.

She holds a degree in Psychology from the University of Porto and several post-graduations within the scope of this discipline. Since 2005, she has been the author of the Psychology syllabus for secondary students. Therese Ydrén has studied political science, law and French language at universities in Sweden and at Institut d'Études Politiques de Lille in France. From 2018-2020 Therese Ydrén was Project Manager for the EaSI-funded project FIER – Fast track integration in European Regions. From 2020-today she is Project Manager for a large ESF-funded project addressed at NEETs inclusion to studies and work.



Filipe Almeida | Portugal Inovação Social

Filipe Almeida is the president of Portugal Social Innovation, a pioneering Government initiative that mobilizes European funds to promote social innovation and social entrepreneurship, as well as develop the social investment market in Portugal. He is also professor of the University of Coimbra and researcher at the Center of Social Studies (CES/FEUC) and Center of Cooperative and Social Economy Studies (CECES/FEUC). He holds a PhD in Business Administration from EBAPE / FGV (Brazilian School of Public Administration and Business, Getúlio Vargas Foundation, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil) and a PhD in Business Management from the University of Coimbra. He is the author of several books and articles in Business Ethics, Corporate Social Responsibility and Academic Fraud.



Márta Márczis | Fostering inclusive integration through public services - City of Miskolc

Márta Márczis is an expert in community-driven local (rural & urban), place-based and regional development, with specific experience in poverty, the environment, social innovation and social economic development. She is member of AEIDL since 2002, elected board member since 2010 and president since 2011. She contributes to action research, programming and technical assistance in relation to sustainable local development, supporting institutional and service development, good governance, job creation, SMEs, public-private partnerships, relevant financial mechanisms, "transition", EU pre-accession processes and programming. She is experienced in creating and implementing programmes for empowerment of citizen initiatives, social innovation and socio-economic inclusion of disadvantaged local communities, such as Roma, Kurdish and Gagauzian communities, women and young people. Márta worked with the United Nation Development Programme (UNDP) Regional Centre for Europe and the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) in Bratislava (Slovakia); as Lead Expert and national coordinator of the European Commission – Council of Europe ROMACT Programme; coordinated the LoSD (Localising Sustainable Development) in the Western-Balkans and the Western CIS countries, and she was the chief advisor and programme leader of the "Cserehát / Košice" UNDP Model Programme, implementing inclusive, community-driven development methods and tools in disadvantaged areas. Since last year, Márta has been working as special advisor on social inclusion for the Mayor of the City of Miskolc in Hungary. She is the lead expert of the EaSI funded 4IM (Establishing and testing integrated interventions aimed at supporting people in the most vulnerable situations - Initiative for innovative integrated interventions in Miskolc) project.

Session in a nutshell:

Social innovation and experimentation represent a powerful approach to meeting the manifold challenges of our time. Structured around iterative loops and collaborative processes, they allow both to test and collect evidence before being implemented at a larger scale and build up the main actor's capacity to design and implement social policy initiatives. This session will explore the potential links between experimentation, mainstreaming and upscaling, especially in the context of the new opportunities created by new legal and financial landscape of the European Social Fund Plus (ESF+).

Speaker: Armelle Ledan | Social Innovation Senior Expert @ AEIDL



Armelle Ledan is a senior expert with 30 years of experience in European programmes and projects management, leading the internal work on social innovation in AEID. She coordinated the Social Innovation Platform (SIE) (2015-2016) and the H2020 Social Innovation Community (SIC) project (2016-2019) leading to the Lisbon Declaration on social innovation. Under the 2014-2020 EaSI programme, she contributed to the assessment of social experimentation projects and developed the methodological guide on social experimentation. She regularly intervenes in European events, gives lectures at Montpellier University and contributed to several EU publications on this topic. She is a European Social Fund expert. Starting with the French ESF Managing Authority, she then joined the European Commission, being successively Desk officer for ESF and EQUAL programmes and the ESF Director's assistant. For the ESF Transnational Platform, she was the coordinator of the networks "Age and career" and "Learning and Skills".

She has participated in the design and management of two EaSI projects: "Pact project" (financed in the 2014 Call) on innovation in the field of social inclusion and "RuralCare" (financed in the 2019 Call), on innovation project in long-term care, currently under development.

Master of Arts in education, sociology and psychology.

Working experience as a jobcoach (team 50 Plus), migration officer, teacher and social worker. In her role as a social worker, Amira has been particularly involved in social-educational family support with a focus on helping to educate young mothers and their children. On a scientific level, Ms. Bieber was a researcher at the German Institute for Educational Research. Apart of the professional background, Amira has more than 20 years' experience on voluntary work with different vulnerable groups. Both as part of her volunteer work and professionally, Amira was involved in several national and international projects dealing with war consequences, democracy or diversity. As part of her job as a jobcoach, Amira made a licence for "train-the-trainer", designed trainings and trained participants on different topics. In 2017, she took over the lead coordination for the EaSI Project "RIAC – Regional Intergration Accelerators", dealing with innovative labour market integration for refugees.

In 2019 she started the department European Project Management (EPM). The EPM is a young and innovative department of Pro Arbeit – Kreis Offenbach (AöR), the communal Jobcenter, created for the implementation of transnational projects, which allows the organization to participate effectively at the European level. Not only EPM is part of the consortium in a variety of projects, but also brings its experience and expertise to European bodies committed to a social and committed Europe.



Selma Kadi | InCARE – EuroCarers

Selma Kadi is a researcher and project manager in the Health and Care Unit at the European Centre for Social Welfare Policy and Research (Austria). She holds a PhD in Sociology from Teesside University (United Kingdom). Before joining the European Centre for Social Welfare Policy and Research, Selma was a postdoctoral researcher at the Institute for History and Ethics of Medicine at Tübingen University (Germany). Selma's research focuses on access, quality and social innovation in longterm care, informal caregiving, and concepts of ageing well. Selma currently coordinates the InCARE project on Supporting INclusive development of community-based long-term CARE services through multi-stakeholder participatory approaches.

Session in a nutshell:


The practical methodological guide on social experimentation aims to support practitioners, primarily future EaSI project promoters preparing a social experimentation proposal in the 2021-2027 programming period. However, it can also be useful for other stakeholders, notably those responding to ESF+ national and regional calls on social innovation under shared management. It can also raise awareness of policymakers and funding organisations at all levels when designing their programmes and calls for proposals.

This session will briefly introduce you to this practical guide co-produced with all 2014-2020 EaSI projects, presenting the 4 main characteristics of a social experimentation project and essential components of a good proposal: (1) social needs assessment; (2) innovative response; (3) results and impact evaluation; (4) scaling and transfer vision. Three panellists from existing EaSI projects will then discuss and comment on these points based on their own experience, providing key takeaways and recommendations for future implementers.
